WHAT & WHY



Information exchange

By supporting multi-stakeholder processes to inform district sustainability monitoring, policy makers, district governments and civil society can enhance efforts to promote sustainability, and market actors can access objective information to meet their due diligence requirements.

JURISDICTIONAL APPROACH



District sustainability is tracked through a set of customised Sustainable Jurisdictions Indicators which can provide information for due diligence as required by global markets.



Districts with low risk of deforestation and high levels of sustainability could better demonstrate progress, while transitions to sustainability would be incentivised in other districts.

- Smallholders' inclusion in supply chains for sustainable palm oil is essential to improve livelihoods and meet sustainability objectives.
- Smallholders need support in overcoming technical, financial and knowledge-related challenges. Issues with land tenure and traceability also need to be addressed.
