
2006 Green Purchasing Law (Japan)

Governance Research Agenda for FLEGT (GRAF, 2013)

A response to the need to provide the EU FLEGT Action Plan with scientific support to improve the implementation and reach of this policy.

The complexities of the interactions in the FLEGT makes quantifying the separate effects of individual efforts a technical challenge.




Legality as prerequisite of sustainability

Shifts in trade need to be better analyzed to understand the causalities and the ultimate consequences



Certification and VPAs are complementary

- 1. Weak law enforcement as a key issue limiting social improvements and livelihoods
- 2. Weak government capacity was a reason outlined for not enforcing the law
- 3. Certified companies are operating in an uneven playing field
- 4. The study pointed to the dangers of certification replacing an absent State
