


EVOLUTION OF LAND COVER















New Zealand Land Use



New Zealand planted forests


interesting facts:

- large amount of "marginal" land available for more forest eg. for biomass to bioeconomy
- 500 planted trees per person
- 90% plantation forestry is radiata pine; 6
 % is Douglas fir
- age = 1 40 years with 60 % of area > 15 yrs old - generally harvested@18-28 years
- ~60% Forest Stewardship Council (FSC) certified
- Maoris now own 40% of the private forest land
- Forestry sector contributes 3% of NZ GDP; 8% of export earnings
- 65% of harvest processed further in New Zealand




NZ planted forests - new plantings


